



Yee haw! These three crafts are inspired by Toy Story, because Jessie the Cowgirl is a Patsy Montana Award Winner! The award is named after Cowgirl Honoree Patsy Montana, who was the first woman to sell a million records with her song, "I Want to Be a Cowboy's Sweetheart." Jessie the Cowgirl continues to entertain others through the tradition of the cowgirl. We will be making three crafts: a pipe cleaner snake based on Sheriff Woody's signature line, "There's a snake in my boot," a slinky dog paper chain, and a Mr. and Mrs. Potato Head paper doll.

## MATERIALS: PIPE CLEANER SNAKE

- Pipe Cleaner
- Beads

- Googly Eyes
- Hot glue or glue

## MATERIALS: SLINKY DOG PAPER CHAIN

- White, brown, and black construction paper
- Googly eyes

- Stapler or glue
- Scissors

## MATERIALS: MR. POTATO HEAD PAPER DOLL

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue


 Optional: Googly eyes, fabric, tissue paper.



1. Take one pipe cleaner and twist the end so that beads cannot fall off the pipe cleaner.



2. Start to string beads on the pipe cleaner. Make a pattern or make it random!



3. After putting beads on the pipe cleaner, leave 3 inches of pipe cleaner free.



4. Twist the pipe cleaner back into the last bead on the pipe cleaner to create a loop. This is the face of the snake.



5. Put two beads of hot glue on either side of the face. Place the googly eyes down on the hot glue beads. Your snake is complete!





1.Cut a dark brown strip of construction paper 1 inch wide, and 9 inches long. Make 5 strips, or as long as you would like your chain to be.



2. Put the two ends of the paper strip together to create a circle.



3. Staple the ends of the strip to create the loop. If you do not have a stapler, use glue and wait for it to dry completely.



4. Put the second strip through the first loop and create another circle.



5. Staple or glue the second loop.



6. Continue making loops until your chain is created.



7. Out of construction paper, cut out a light brown circle for the face, two dark brown ears, a white nose bridge and black nose. Additionally, you can cut out two light brown strips for feet and a dark brown strip for the tail.



9. Attach the face, legs, an tail! Your slinky dog chain is complete!

8. Glue the face together and let dry.







1. Cut out the potato template from our website. Trace onto a brown piece of construction paper and cut out.

2. Cut out a mouth, nose, ears, lips, eyebrows. Be creative! These can be whatever you would like—you don't even have to follow those guidelines. Adding a hat, bandana, earrings, or necklace is also a fun addition. Have fun making your potato head unique.

3. Glue down the face onto your potato. Your potato head is complete!
